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ANNUAL REPORT 2020 - 2021

With the threat of Pandemic still not having disappeared, I am pleased to present the Annual Report for the year 2020-2021 in front of the Council in a closed forum with the Standard Operating Protocol (SOP) in force. The 2020-2021 presented a huge challenge not only to the teaching community, but also to the entire world bringing it upside down. It even brought the developed country which was boasting on its inventive medicines to take on the pandemic, on its knees. The world came to a standstill. To be brief, Covid-19 created a new world norm and a "New Normal" came into being and educational institutions were not an exception to this onslaught of Covid-19. In March 2020, lockdown was imposed and the academia was at loss as to how to resume the unfinished academic year. When the colleges reopened in the academic year 2020, the teaching fraternity were shocked to find empty class rooms. But, they were instructed to continue teaching through virtual mode. In addition to acquiring expertise to reach out to the students online through Google Meet/Zoom, teachers were also entrusted with responsibility of online admission through TNGASA. Besides. the Examination cell had to devise suitable strategies to conduct semester examinations online and publish the results. The situation presented a huge challenge to the teachers which they would have never ever encountered in their career. I congratulate the teachers for being able to combat the





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challenge presented by Covid-19 and carry out the curricular and cocurricular activities as if everything was normal.

To enable the teachers to make smooth transition from offline to online teaching, a webinar on "Online teaching" was conducted to help the teachers reach out to the students through Google Meet/Zoom platforms besides helping them to issue study materials to the students. Enrolment for fresh students was completed online through TNGASA. In addition, the teachers had to come up with either new strategies to conduct practical's in a virtual mode or physical mode maintaining Standard Operating Protocol (SOP). Rs.30,900 was allotted towards purchase of books and journals. In addition, State Government of Tamil Nadu released a grant of Rs.2,25,000 towards equipments which was distributed to the Departments. Department of Atomic Energy sanctioned a major research project to the Centre for Nonlinear Science (CeNSc) worth Rs.15,87,400 and a first instalment of Rs.2,00,200 was received.

This year, we had an enrolment of 93.07% for UG and PG Programmes and a total strength of 4503 students. 1224 students got enrolled in Computer Literacy Programme (CLP). The examination system was geared up to face the challenging situations for the conduct of examinations, valuations and mark entry. The Examinations software was updated to adopt the directions of government related to the examinations. Learning portal was created for facilitating the students who couldn't attend online classes to get





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an access to study materials. The component of CIA was revised to include online seminars, quiz, assignments, etc. Faculty created videos in social media facilitating the students to get an access to e-learning. All examination related informations were circulated to students through email and class WhatsApp groups. Online Examinations for the even semester of academic year 2019-20 were held during 21-30, September 2020. Offline classes partially resumed on 7th December, 2020. Online examinations for odd semester for the academic year 20-21 were held during 21st -30th, December, 2020. 24 teachers attended online Orientation/Refresher/Short Term Course or FDP during this academic year thereby, contributing to the enhancement of teaching-learning process. AISHE report was submitted on 01/02/2022. Green /Environmental audit of the campus led to the installation of "Floats" in water tanks. Energy audit has also ensured reduction in power consumption.

3 Symposia on language and communication skills, 6 on life skills and 11 on awareness of trends and technology were conducted this year online to enhance the skills of the students. A total of 327 students have either gone on to take up placement or higher studies. 16 students got qualified in state level examinations.
