1. INTRODUCTION

Examination wing of Government College for Women, Kumbakonam was established in the year 2006 - 2007 as a statutory body constituted in accordance with the UGC guidelines for autonomous colleges. The wing is headed by the Controller of Examinations(CoE), reporting to the Principal being the Chief Controller of examination and supported by the Deputy Controller and clerical staff. The primary responsibility of the Office of Examinations is to plan and conduct all examinations in a fair, transparent and systematic manner as per the academic Calendar prepared at the beginning of every academic year.

The examination procedures are in accordance with the guidelines of the Examination Manual which is in accordance with the Bharathidasan University and is in conformity with the UGC guidelines from time to time. The examination wing is responsible for generation of question papers, registration for examinations, evaluation processes, preparation and publication of examination results, and printing of consolidated mark statements.

The office of examinations is committed to ensure efficient and effective functioning of its office for the benefit of the stake holders. The process is subject to change as and when there is a need for the welfare of the students. In this academic year, when few students were not able to appear for the November 2018 Semester Examinations due to Gaja Cyclone, a special re-exam was conducted without payment of fees for the re-exam.

Conduct of End Semester Examinations:

- In addition to continuous evaluation component, the end semester examination, which will be a written-type examination of at least 3 hours duration (extra time of one hour for disabled students as per University letter Ref: Letter No: 7059/K1/2009-2, Dated: 06.08.2009), would also form an integral component of the evaluation.
- All those students who have been enlisted with required number of days of attendance
 are eligible to appear for the ESE irrespective of whether they have passed in the CIA
 or not. Hall tickets will be issued only for those who have enough attendance and
 have paid the fees.
- Examination timetable is generated through the COE software and is made available in the college website and also distributed to the departments.
- The students must bring the Hall Ticket and their College ID card to every session of the End Semester Examinations for verification. If the students fail to bring the hall ticket, a penalty of Rs 100/- will be levied along with a request letter for getting duplicate hall ticket.
- Students can bring ordinary Scientific / Engineering calculators only into the Examination Hall. They can use mathematical, statistical or any other Table, (if required) provided by the College during the ESE. Students are not allowed to bring programmable calculators / mobile phones or any other electronic communication devices or unwanted materials into the examination hall. Bringing in such things would be considered as malpractice.

Evaluation Process – End Semester Examinations:

Part I, Part II and Part III courses are valued by external examiners of the respective subjects. A chief examiner is appointed for every 6 examiners. Central Valuation is undertaken by a senior staff member as the Camp officer.

Other than NME Courses, valuation of all Part IV courses are done by internal examiners.
